- ◆ Information from college and university library catalogs.

1. I understand the primary purpose of access to any information through the Internet should be to support classroom learning (i.e. research papers, projects.)
2. I agree not to participate in the transfer of inappropriate or illegal materials through the Internet.
 - Illegal activities is defined as a violation of local, state, and/or federal law.
3. I agree not to download any software, toolbars, games, programs or information through the Internet.
4. I agree not to purchase or sell anything over the Internet.
5. I agree not to participate in chat rooms or Instant Messaging, FaceBook or MySpace.
6. I agree not to print off of the internet without permission.
7. I understand that I can e-mail for only ½ hour per day.
8. I agree not to use Internet Music Videos, Online radio, or Listen to Internet Music.
9. I realize that use of the Internet is a privilege, not a right. I accept that inappropriate use will lead to my losing that privilege.
